

Community Liaison Report Brazos Mutual Domestic Water Consumers Association Report Date: June 1, 2026 Activity Period: May 2026 Tank Level Inspections Water supply tank levels were checked almost daily throughout the month of May. The system performed as intended and maintained adequate storage levels despite increased seasonal demand. The Memorial Day holiday weekend provided an early test of the system as occupancy and water usage increased throughout the service area. The system responded well and continued to operate without significant issues. Overall, system performance during this period was excellent. Meter Monitoring Random meter checks were conducted throughout the month as part of ongoing system monitoring efforts. During one inspection, a cracked water meter was identified at 4 Falls Creek Road. Water Operator Daniel Gonzales and the Association Board President were notified of the issue. Plans are in place to replace the damaged meter as soon as possible to ensure accurate readings and prevent future problems. System Status The water system functioned as intended throughout May. Storage levels remained satisfactory, and no major operational concerns were identified during routine monitoring activities. While system performance remains strong, the region continues to experience severe drought conditions. Water conservation efforts will be increasingly important moving into the summer months. Encouraging responsible water use and monitoring system demand will help protect available water resources during what is expected to be a challenging season. Looking Ahead Continued monitoring of tank levels, system performance, and water usage trends will remain a primary focus throughout the summer months. Regular inspections and meter checks will continue to help identify potential issues early and support reliable service for Association members.
